It has been the first full year for our Chair, Katy, who has guided the choir through this very exciting season, which our members agree she has managed to do in grand style.



Autumn 2024



In September 2024, our new season started officially with a wonderfully inventive collaboration with the Choir of St George's School, Windsor, on a celebration of English music featuring Britten's St Nicholas. This sell-out concert saw an imaginative use of the new All Saints space, with 2 conductors, 3 accompanists on organ and piano duet, terrific tenor and bass soloists, the skilled Chameleon Arts Orchestra, the 2 choirs occupying separate ends of the church, choreographed swaps of position between them, and even 3 'pickled boys' walking up the aisle through the audience!

Christmas 2024



On 7th December, Wokingham Town Council's Christmas charity event featured WCS (led by Rober Grindley), Woodley Concert Band, RMVC, the Ukrainian Choir, and piano duets by James Speakman and George. On 11th December, a group from WCS sang carols at Acorn Community Centre in Woosehill, organised by Richard Turner. Our last rehearsal on 12th December included a 'fizz & mincepies' social, and on the 14th we rounded off our Christmas term with a lovely family concert of both traditional and jazz-inspired carols, raising a tremendous £687 for the choir's and Mayor's charities.


Spring 2025

The constant backdrop to all other choir activities last season was the prolonged and meticulous planning required for our performance of Elgar's Dream of Gerontius with Bracknell Choral Society on 22nd March at Guildford Cathedral.

16 months in the making, the sheer size of the project became clear as we started pulling together the forces required; an estimated 200 singers across 3 choirs (double choir plus semichorus), 60-piece orchestra with organ, professional soloists, and the prestigious Guildford Cathedral venue.

The popularity of the Dream of Gerontius in its 125th year attracted an audience of nearly 500. It was wonderful to see such a large venue so full, making the performance more rewarding and the financials less negative! The sound and volume of the orchestra was spine-tingling, as was singing with so many other voices.

All WCS concerts take a lot of people and planning to make them happen, but organising an event of such complexity and epic proportions took stamina and detailed coordination by the joint working committee from the two choirs. It was an absolute pleasure working with George, Greg Hallam (BCS MD), Ben Giddens and Nick Austin (Accompanists), the external semi-chorus singers, and all the choir members on this unique project.



Summer 2025

Our concert on 21st June was titled 'And all the people rejoiced', a majestic programme comprising rousing choral pieces by Mozart, Haydn, Brahms, Handel and Parry, plus beautiful individual pieces and a quartet by our soloists, and an entertaining piano/organ Mozart duet by George and Ben. Feedback on the concert was incredibly positive, describing it as a triumph, joyful, outstanding, amazing, passionate, and more. Special mention must go to our 4 young soloists who were wonderful, adding hugely to the success of the concert and deservedly receiving fulsome praise from choir and audience.

All our concerts last season, apart from the Dream of Gerontius, were at All Saints Church Wokingham which is proving to be a lovely and flexible 'home' venue for WCS. We thank the Church team for all their support and look forward to working with them again on our 2025/26 concerts.



Charity Fundraising

This season, our choir charity has been the Alexander Devine Children's Hospice Service. Between the retiring collections at our Christmas and Summer concerts, and the Gerontius concert with BCS, we are proud to have raised £2,169.50 for the charity.
